ARA President's Message Debbie Hardwick-Smith

imothy Shanahan is a keynote speaker at our conference this year. As I was reading information about him I ran upon this quote...it was under the umbrella of Literacy Inflation: "Look at it this way. Let's say in 1971 you had one thousand dollars and you wanted to save it so you hid it in your mattress. You've put it away and now you've held it for 30 years. No one stole it so now you take it out that thousand dollars and you want to spend it. It buys a whole lot less now than it would in 1971.

That thousand dollars has lost value because currency has inflated over the last 30 years. Sort of the same thing has happened to literacy. Having 1971 literacy skills, is just like having 1971 money...it isn't such a great deal. And the reason for that is because of two things: 1) the incredible growth of technology, and 2) the internalization of our markets and our world."

As educators the task before us is HUGE. We can no longer rely on the strategies to teach reading that we relied on even five years ago. Our students learn differently than they did five years ago. We are poorer, more diverse, and our students are sometimes exposed to things we have only seen and heard about on Jerry Springer! Students are mesmerized by games on Xbox, speak a language other than English and have difficulties that arise from poverty and a struggling economy. Our students will compete for jobs with young adults that have degrees before they can be a mechanic to work on your car!

Really...What are we to do? Well, your presence at this ARA Conference is a good step to take in answering that question. We MUST read about everything that is important to us and ...educating our students so that their future is filled with hope and success must be our number one priority. We can no longer JUST teach reading...We MUST teach for acceleration. We are behind. When you hear someone say, "Okay, let's try it (a canned program that may claim to be geared to cracking Common Core State Standards...) it can't hurt them." STOP...YES...IT CAN HURT THEM...We have absolutely NO time to do ANYTHING that is not absolutely assisting students in making accelerated growth in the area of literacy. It is our moral obligation as teachers and educators.

Enjoy the conference. Learn...Read...Listen...voraciously.... to everything you can on how to implement the Common Core State Standards... THEY ARE NOT "WHAT WE USED TO DO!" They are what we needed to be doing and failed to do...Work like researchers and detectives!!!! Our children...our state...our nation ...are all counting on you! LET'S CRACK THE CODE! 🍽
